

- Has this crisis revealed a new focus for our Church in terms of mission and vision?
- Have we identified new ministry priorities coming out of Covid-19, and do we have the right leadership capacity to move into that new focus?
- Is our Church leadership team suitable for our next season of ministry?

"Then Jesus spoke again unto them saying, I am the Light of the World: he that follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the Light of Life." John 8:12 NKJV

The year 2020 will no doubt go

down into history as a year in which the world literally turned upside down. Every nation has been impacted by an unknown phenomenon none as the Coronavirus. 

The Gospel Corner with Proclaimer of the Word...

Let's Just Praise the Lord

Psalms 100:1-5

1. Introduction

I want to admonish you today that we should praise the Lord. We have done everything else. Some people have enjoyed turkey and dressing with a little hit of crapherry sauce. Some nenple have enjoyed sweet potato pie and others have enjoyed pumpkin pie. Some people have enjoyed collard greens and black-eye peas with corn on the cobb. Some people have felt God's presence throughout the years while others are learning to lean and depend on the Lord. As I walk along this Christian journey, I realize something about walking with the Lord. The more you walk with Him, the more you will want to praise Him. You will find yourselves lifting a praise in a season of dark dispositions and disappointments in life. You will find yourselves lifting a praise in the middle of a public disturbance. We can still praise the Lord in the pandemic because we know that God is still in control. I have discovered that we cannot walk with God without walking in praise to Him. When we walk and talk with God, we are giving Him the praises and as we walk with God, we will talk with God. The bible informs us that two cannot walk together unless they agree. Praise and Prayer on hand in hand. Praise channes the way I pray. Praise will change the way that we see God. When your troubles and trials in life appear big, (sometimes the load gets a little heavy, but He is a heavy load-sharer and a burden hearer) we should know that our God is hinger than any problem that we may encounter. Praise ushers us into God's presence. Once we are in God's presence then we can truly have a

When I start to praise, I close the door of despair and I open the door of deliverance. Is there anybody in the house that is ready to get their deliverance right now. I close the door to the world and I open the door to the Lord.

Praise dissipates worry and dilutes concern and fear. Praise tarnishes sadness and magnifies God's goodness. Praise is one of the languages of faith. Praise capitalizes on Who and What truly matters. It focuses on the Lord and we can praise our way out.

The Psalm 100 tells us how to enter the presence of God. This psalm is a literary masterpiece. It has been said that the Bible is shallow enough that the immature can play without drowning, but it is deep enough that the most mature can never touch the bottom. Such is Psalms 100. When studying Psalms 100, one gets the impression that it is inappropriate to come into God's presence any kind of way. When Esther had to approach the king, she couldn't do it any kind of way. It was dangerous and hazardous to your health to approach the king any kind of way. When it comes to our worship experience, we must pull off worldly desires and put on our godly attire. As believers, we must take the proper actions and necessary steps before coming into God's holy presence. God is willing to meet us anywhere, anyplace, and anytime, but we need to come into his presence with heart and mind, body and soul that acknowledges Him as the King of Kings.

2. The Call to Praise the Lord, v.1

The writer of this Psalm informs the believer that we should make a joyful shout unto the Lord. He does not say that we should make a silent gesture but rather a joyful shout. The Hebrew word for a loud praise is to "Shabach"



the Lord. The imperative form of praise expresses a command to the believers that they should shout. You should have a praise down on the inside that is so full that you are ready to let it out. It is so down deep inside of you that your praise cannot stay silent. You must shabach the Lord! Did the Lord do something for you? Did He save your soul from a burning hell? The blood still works! My hible tells me that "Jesus paid it all and all to Him I owe." We owe God our praise and worship. Are you ready to "Shabach" the Lord this morning? Do we have anybody that is willing to just praise the Lord? Somebody ought to say, "Yes Lord". Psalms 100:1 is a strong invitation to worship the Lord God with a loud praise. Tell Him thank

Please note that God does not need us to help Him do anything. We don't praise Him because He needs us but rather we praise God because we need Him. I am reminded of the song that they song in the old church, "I need Thee Every Hour." Oh, I need Thee." "Every hour I need Thee, O bless me now, my Savior." This was a lyrical expression of corruptible humanity needing an incorruptible God. God does not need us to wake somebody up. He does not need us to speak to creation on His behalf. He does not need us to speak to the winds on the waters. He does not need us to tell the stars when they should shine.

However, it is His will that we should serve the Lord and we should devote ourselves to his service. We should not only devote ourselves to the worship experience, but we should emplay ourselves in it. There's something for everybody to do. In Psalms 116:12-14; we find the words; "What shall I render unto the Lord for all of His benefits." David was saying that God has been too good to me and I just can't keep it to myself. All too many times, people say that I don't have anything to do but all believers owe it to God to worship Him. This is the work that every believer should be employed in. When you are not getting treated fairly on that job, you ought to still be able to lift a praise and tell the Lord, thank you. When the children are not acting right, you should still lift a praise. When the in-laws are not acting right, you should still lift a praise because God did something for us that we could not do for ourselves. When the outlaws are not acting right, you should still lift a praise and tell the Lord thank you. Right here, the old preacher would say, "the blood ran down from Calvary's Cross. He died upon an old rugged cross but early Sunday morning!" We should not only serve him in all instances of obedience to his law, but that we should come before his presence in the ordinances which he has appointed. Since we are in a pandemic, the Lord has blessed many people with the option of worshipping the Lord via various means of internet options. I thank the Lord for the church and I thank Him for the available option of Facebook live and YouTube streaming live. Those of us should testify that the Lord has

been good.

3. The Call to Serve the Lord, v. 2

We know that the imperative form of praise is to shout but there is an emotional element of praise. We should serve the Lord joyfully. Are you excited about what the Lord is doing in your life? We are directed to serve the Lord with gladness and come before His presence with singing. Have you ever come to the place of worship and when you got there, you did not feel well? But when you left the place of worship, you were feeling quite well. We used to say, serving the Lord will pay off after a while. But, I am here to tell you that serving the Lord pays off right now!

As we delve into the call to serve the Lord. we will find that there are several asperts of service. First, there is "what" type of service should everyone be doing. Everyone should praise and shabach the Lord. The function of our praise is a part of our service. Second, there is the "how" should we arraise the Lord? The Psalmist informs the believer that we should "serve the Lord with gladness." The attitude of our gratitude should cause us to rejoice with singing. Did anybody get up with a song this morning? Thirdly, there is "who" are you giving the praise? The object of our praise is to the Lord. Fourth, "why" should we give God the praise? God is full of grace and mercy. Our God is a good God!

4. The Cause for Praising the Lord, v. 3-5

Now, let me ask you a question. Can I ask you a question? Did He wake you up this morning? Did He give you a portion of health and strength? I know that you could not get with all the kinfolk but thank God that you were able to get with one or two on Thanksgiving Day. Was the blood still running warm in your veins? I thank the Lord that the bed that we laid down on last night: wasn't our cooling board and the sheets that we covered up with Father was not our winding clothes.

Wait a minute, I think that someone missed their cue to praise the Lord. Somebody, tell Him thank you! Have you got your praise on today?

The Lord is God and He is the only living and true God. Our God is a Being that is infinitely nerfect self-existent and self-sufficient flur God is the fountain of all being. God is not a man as we are. He is an eternal Spirit, whom is incomprehensible and independent. He is the first and the last. He is the Alpha and Omega. We worship him that made us and all the whole wide world. The Lord God is the Creator of every good and perfect gift. It is he that has made us, and not we ourselves. The Lord God gave us our being and He is the Father of our spirits. We did not and could not make ourselves. It is God's prerogative to make man in His own image. As a result, God is our rightful owner. He has an incontestable right to everything that was made. This is the cause and the reason for our worship!
