

2020 is in the books and, by the grace and mercy of our Loving God, we get the chance to hang out in 2021 for the next twelve months. As this brand, spanking New Year kicks off and you start the first pages of your Church calendar, it's natural to look back over the past twelve months and think deeply about everything that's happened, collectively, personally, and vocationally. Looking back is only helpful if you can turn considered positive experiences? your audit into action.

Number four, learn. Now that vou've had time to review and reflect, you can begin to ask deeper ministry to the next level? How do you view your challenges or failures as assets and not liabilities? How do you leverage those situations that might not normally be ences across the country.



Changing your perspective on the difficult times of 2020 will help propel you to success in the future and will make you a more effective leader.

Reflect. Review. Learn. Then, summarize and evaluate. 2020 is now in the history books. Due to the impact of COVID-19, social upheaval and political instability are at least three hallmarks of the past year, but 2021 presents us with a fresh start of sorts. Create a summary of your year - the good, the bad and the ugly - to use when you sit down to plan for the new year. Evaluate your ministry trajectory. If you continue in the same direction, where will you be this time next year?

While you want to focus on your strengths, you don't want to neglect the areas where you do need to improve. (3) Scrap what isn't working at all. # Speak Life Thought

with First Lady & Co-Pastor Yolanda G. Butler

#### A RECHARGED Life

"Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you will [recharge] me." (Ps. 138:7)

Cell phones and all its gismos and attachments are a common commodity of today. We use them every day all day. These devices are not self-charging and therefore at some point we must place them on a charger to get recharged so they can be ready to be used once again to their optimum capacity. The preceding year challenged us in more ways than we could have ever imagined. I want to encourage you to take a moment to place yourself on the Father's spiritual charger for a recharge.

To recharge means to return to a normal state of mind or strength after exertion. After experiencing shame and repentance, King David asked the Father to restore the joy of his salvation and cause his broken bones to rejoice again. (Ps. 51:12 and 51:8) After pouring out her heart and weeping until she had no more weep in her, Hannah's prayer was answered and she exclaimed in faith, "my heart rejoices in the Lord. He has made me strong." (1 Sam 2:1) After receiving word that his final days were coming to an end, the Father heard the tears of his son King Hezekiah and restored

him and let him live another fifteen years! (Is. 38:15)

In order for something to be recharged it means some aspect of life has been drained from it. As you reflect back on the past year, has something drained life from you? Do you feel like a piece of you was left behind? Was it loss of a loved one, a job, a relationship...? Was it mental anxiety from so many restrictions being placed on the nation? Was it the pressures you faced every day? Daily and/or weekly COVID testing? Work in the medical field? Work in the educational industry? Family? Escalated pressures of ministry? I submit to you that whatever has drained vou is worth you getting a spiritual recharge.

Recharge involves several stages. First, you must plug into the Power Source. Humble yourself and get to a place where you know you need help and that is in the Master. Jesus said, 'Come to me all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." (Matt. 11:28) Secondly, be still and quiet during your recharge. The psalmist said, "He makes me lie down." (Ps. 23:2) and God has said Himself, "Be still and know that I am God." (Ps. 46:10). It is during this process that you just need to be quiet, be refreshed, get yourself together in every aspect of your humannessbody, mind, and spirit. Thirdly,



receive your strength as you recharge. Let Holy Spirit pour into you for "He gives power to the weak, and to those who have no might He increases strength." (Is. 40:29) And finally, walk in your recharge. Once you see that you cell is all charged up you begin to put it to full use immediately. Paul admonished Timothy to fully carry out the ministry God gave to him. (1 Tim 4:5) This is what our Father requires of us as well. Be living and breathing masterpieces created by God through Jesus Christ to do His works that He planned a long time ago. (Rom 12:1, Eph 2:10)

So, my dear hearts, be determined this year to get your daily recharge and let us make a BIG impact for the Kingdom of God and frustrate the devil's territory in Jesus name.

# James Cash, Historic I.M. Terrell High School Alumni, Honored with Harvard Business School Building Renaming

Harvard Business School announced that it would honor James I. Cash, a retired HBS faculty member known for breaking barriers for Black people and for his leadership at the School, by renaming a building on its campus. The new Cash House name was unveiled in a virtual town hall attended by faculty, staff, and students.

Cash joined the faculty of Harvard Business School in 1976 after receiving his MS and PhD degrees in computer science from Purdue University and became the first Black tenured professor at the School in 1985. It was the latest in a long line of remarkable accomplishments for a man already known as a trailblazer. Born and raised in Fort Worth, Texas and a graduate of historic I.M. Terrell High School, he was the first African American to accept a basketball scholarship in the Southwest Conference after signing on at Texas Christian University (TCU) in 1965. At six-foot-six, he dominated on




the court and also in the classroom, where he majored in mathematics, becoming an Academic All-American in his last two years at TCU. As a Black student athlete in the south, he frequently encountered racism, even requiring a police escort when the team visited the University of Arkansas.

While at HBS, Cash's scholarly work focused on the still nascent field of information technology. He quickly

became a sought-after expert on the strategic use of IT. In the class-room, Cash was a powerful role model; he taught both in the MBA Program and in Executive Education, including the Program for Management Development, the Program for Global Leadership, and the Advanced Management Program. He also became a leader in the administration, serving as Chairman of the MBA Program, Chair of Baker Library, and Senior Associate Dean and Chairman of Harvard Business Publishing.

Beyond the School, his writing—in books, journals, and Harvard Business Review—caught the attention of CEOs of several major firms. Over time, his expertise, integrity, and judgment earned him seats, often as the first Black member, on the boards of Microsoft Corporation, Walmart, General Electric, Sprint, State Street Corporation, and The Chubb Ltd., among others.



# The Gospel Corner with Proclaimer of the Word...

#### Reasons to Rejoice

1 Peter 1:6-9

#### 1. Introduction

Since the onslaught of the novel coronavirus that was first identified in Wuhan, China, there have been many cases of this virus globally. The coronavirus has affected many people across the world and it has affected many people that we know personally. We can no longer respond to this virus as a distant tragedy in the lives of other people, but it has come to our doorsteps in America. We must obey the guidelines of the CDC and mask up. Sometimes good people suffer in the common calamity of the world. Sometimes good people die, and others wonder why the Lord took this person of faith. The value of good people should not be estimated by their present struggles and situations. When we look at James 1:2, we understand that we should "count it all joy when we enter into various trials." When Christians endure hard trials and afflictions, we are pronounced blessed and we are assured of a glorious reward. This is a reason to rejoice my brothers and sisters! James informs the believer that there is a certain code of conduct for Christians as we respond to the crosses in our lives. We cannot fall to pieces and doubt the God of our salvation. We must remain prayerful and hopeful that our God is bigger than any problem we may encounter. Do you believe our God is bigger than any problem

The bible informs the believer that "weeping may endure for a night, but joy comes in the morning." Although we weep because of the senseless killings of black and brown children in our streets, there is a brighter day coming. There is a better day ahead when we will see increased racial equality in our land. I believe things will get better if we can trust Him and never doubt Him. I believe this country will one day live out its true creed and not judge a man on the color of his skin but rather on the content of his character. I believe the day will become brighter as we begin to place our faith in the rock of our Salvation and not place too much emphasis on the troubles

In America, we have been requested to avoid large family gatherings and stay home to stay safe. One might say that we are dispersed and separated from our families due to the coronavirus. Nevertheless, we are encouraged of a brighter day in 2021! In 1 Thessalonians 5:8, the Apostle Paul informs the believers that we wear the hope of salvation. We must live by faith, and this will keep us watchful and sober. We should believe that our God has a watchful eye upon all His children and He is able to bring us through any heartache and pain. Do you believe God is able?

As we approach our text, we find that the twelve tribes of Israel were scattered There were Jews dispersed to Assyria, Babylon, Egypt. This was a great tragedy to be dispersed from one's homeland and suffer persecution from the Roman emperor Nero. I can only imagine that it was tough during those biblical days when the Jews were taken from their promised homeland and they had to endure hard trials. The Apostle Paul encourages the believers that were scattered abroad. Although they were



discouraged because of their current location/turmoil in the land, yet the Lord has provided an inheritance for them that is incomparable, incorruptible, and inexpressible. The inheritance is safe in heaven and no one can put you out. No one or nothing can prevent the believer from the secured happiness of the heavenly estate. The thief nor the robber can prevent the believer from what the Lord has stored up for the believer. The Lord God gives the believer grace and mercy to all His children. It is totally inexpressible of what heaven will be like, but it will be unspeakable joy!

#### 2. Faith Beyond our Current Season, v.6

According to biblical scholars, the backdrop of this text involved the burning of Rome in A.D. 64. It has been stated that Nero was the one responsible for this fire. However. Nero sought for a convenient scapegoat and he stated that the infant church was the trouble-maker. Today, we are faced with political leaders that tend to place blame on everybody else instead of taking responsibility themselves. The fire around A.D. 64 resulted in the virtual destruction of three of the fourteen districts into which Rome was divided. Nero launched a campaign of fearful assault against the young church. In A.D. 67. war broke out with the Jews and it ended in the demise of the Jewish state. The Apostle Peter wrote this epistle between A.D. 64 and A.D. 67. This time frame was between the outbreak of the Christian persecution by Nero and the outbreak of the Jewish war. Peter understood the current struggles of the young church and he decided to write a letter of consolation and comfort to the young church. Today, we as believers have been perplexed on every side. There is the back and forth arguments between political leaders which tend to threaten the cords of our democracy. Yet we can ascertain from 1 Peter that there is hope for tomorrow.

Our faith must not stop at what we can see but it must reach the areas that we cannot see. We learn from Hebrews 11:1 that faith is the substance of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen. What are you hoping for? Despite the turmoil in the early church at Rome, the Apostle Peter had a message for the season. In verse 6. Peter states, "Wherein ve greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations." The early church had suffered many adversities or trials of faith. These were manifold temptations because there were sever-The effect of all these troubles and trials was great heaviness. As human beings, we are subject to personal and public sorrows. As Christians, we have a duty to have compassion on people who are sometimes mistreated by a system of government that tends to hurt rather

than help. We must have com passion on our health-care workers and their families. The affections and sorrows of good people are but for a little while. It is sometimes in the struggles of life that we develop strength for the season. The troubles and trials that we go through will never last longer than the Lord sees fit. We must remember that our great Salvation is proven by the trials of persecution. There was a song sang in church, "Must Jesus Bear the cross along and all this world go free; no there is a cross for you and there is a cross for me." We must maintain our faith in God despite a season of turmoil. Our faith should soar above life's temptations!

#### 3. Faith Beyond the Test, v. 7

God's purpose in allowing trouble is to test the reality of one's faith. The benefits of the trial by fire is for the Christian. Although Rome was burned during this time, yet this season serves as a testimony to future Christians that we can make it despite the fiery trials of life. When a believer comes through a trial still trusting the Lord, the believer is assured that their faith is genuine

Faith is precious that overcomes the fiery trials of life. A faith that is never tested is not worthy of salvation. A genuine faith is more precious than gold! The effect of a fiery trial is that it will result in praise, honor, and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ. The afflictions of the believer are designed for the trial of their faith. The Lord God does not allow a trial to destroy the believer but rather it is to the believer's advantage. Our Christianity depends upon our faith. Where is your faith in God? The faith of good people during a trial will provide future comfort for a testimony to others. God will get the glory from our faith testimonies. We learn from the early church that we can live with confidence in knowing that our God can sustain us. Although the fire caused much damage in the Roman empire, it did not extinguish the faith of the early church. Today, we employ our faith during times like these. This is another reason to rejoice!

#### 4. Faith that Expresses Love, v. 8

It is one thing to believe in God, but it is another thing to subject oneself to the law of Christ. We must execute reliance and the expectation of all the promises from Him. When we have faith, love and joy, we will rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory. Faith assures the believer of the abundant things in Christ. True faith is never alone but it produces strong love for Jesus Christ. Sense and reason will stop at the door, but faith sees bevond the door of entanglement and looks toward the Light!

As we conclude this sermonic expression of faith, let's recap the text in the follow-

- 1) Trials and tribulations will come in the Christians life
- 2) You can make it if you maintain your faith in Jesus Christ
- 3) At last, you will reap a life of everlasting joy and peace
