





Our mission in life, once we've accepted Christ is to be an ambassador for Christ and since we never know who we're talking to at any given time and what glory God expects to get from our encounters, I say, pray first, listen second and trust God to lead you all the way. If we practice it and form the habit of yielding to the Holy Spirit, it will serve us well and God will always get the glory, even in conflict, they will see the Christ in you and perhaps want to know what you know and who you serve.

Pray in the morning, pray at noonday and pray at night and at every corner you turn or person you meet, all day, every day, ask God to be with you for His Godly purpose and His Godly outcome.



# "The LEADER'S EDGE" by drmichaelbell

Not having enough money is a huge problem in life and in ministry. Yet in too many Churches it's just the way things are. When a congregation doesn't have enough money, anxiety goes up and expectations take a hit. And, then the church looks for solutions, usually to their pastor first. And when a pastor is uncomfortable talking about money, everyone is thrown off.

The perennial challenge Church leadership has is how do we do more ministry with so little money?

If you are a pastor, a ministry or auxiliary leader, do you recall when you visited that mega-Church or that large-membership congregation and thought if our Church only had a tenth of their money and their people, it would instantly solve our problems. And then we go back to our own neck of the woods and get almost instantly depressed.

So when you have very little or almost no money for ministry, where do you start?

Well, one thing is certain, the Church has to talk about money. I understand this topic is uncomfortable for many pastors and lay leaders. But talking about money is critical to equipping the members of your Church to live out their faith in Christ. Truth is, God has a lot to say about money in the Sacred Writ. There are more than 2,000 scriptures on tithing, money, and possessions in the Old and New Testaments. That's double the number of references to faith and prayer combined.

Now, a rule of thumb in talking about money in Church is make sure you don't make promises God doesn't make! It's easy to make promises God doesn't make when it comes to money. . .especially with passages like Malachi 3.

Is God faithful? Yes!
Does God bless people financially
when they give? Yes!
Are there lots of wealthy people who
don't give? Yes!

Are God's blessings to us always financial reimbursement? **No!** This one mistake in preaching and teaching on money had led to lot of damage.

There is one more footnote I need to share with you. The topic of money is not about money per se. The Kingdom of God and helping people to live as disciples of Christ is the true purpose of money. In the words of Peter Greer, "Money is a vehicle, not the ultimate objective."

How can you lead when resources are scarce to non-existent?

1. Cast A Compelling Vision. Every leader needs to be able to vision cast. Vision in any organization is simply a mental picture of where the organization can be in the future. Andy Stanley says it this way, "Vision is about what



could be and should be.'

Vision creates something out of nothing. It turns impossibility into possibility. It translates your dream into reality. It startles people out of their complacency, stops them from settling for less and moves them to action they wouldn't otherwise take except for the vision of what could be. Unless you're casting a vision of the work God has called you and your Church to accomplish, your congregation will not sense a calling to participate in the work of the Church. Help your congregation see that their financial sacrifices are supporting God's work by painting a picture of how God is at work in and through your Church.

- 2. Start With Who You Have. When I came to my present Church, we didn't have \$700 in the bank. I remember how excited we were when our attendance was up to 40! We were housed in two blighted buildings. I had to start with who I had. And, frankly, I inherited a small group of teachable, passionate people...and the Lord blessed us to give and grow!
- 3. Believe This Is Only The Beginning. Leaders are hope dealers! You ever heard of the "yeah, but" syndrome? "Yeah, but" is founded on excuse-oriented thinking. When we start making "yeah, but" kinds of excuses, God responds, "Is anything too hard for me?" (Genesis 18:14). Do you really think parking is an issue that can't be overcome? Does limited classroom space prompt you to doubt God's ability to "do exceeding, abundantly above all we can ask or imagine" (Ephesians

This is only the beginning! Paul told the Philippian believers, "I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished" (*Philippians 1:6*). Our ocean parting, miracle working, raising from the dead God is not going to back off from doing what needs to be done to reach every last person in our area! Our God is Jehovah Jireh!

# "Speak Life Thought" with First Lady & Co-Pastor Yolanda G. Butler

A Life Taught to Pray

Luke 11:1 "And it came to pass, that, as He was praying in a certain place, when He ceased, one of His disciples said unto Him, Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples."

Have you ever wondered why the disciples asked their Master to teach them how to pray? They had a great deal of respect for John the Baptist and observed how he taught his disciples a certain level of prayer they were unfamiliar with. It is only befitting that as followers of Jesus Christ, The Great Teacher, would teach them in like fashion. It seems odd for them to make such a request when in actuality they knew how to pray. Hebrew boys were trained early in their youth how to pray handwritten prayers. Jesus would later caution believers to refrain from the outward practice of repetitive prayers. (Matt. 6:7) Jesus labeled these types of prayers as vain for they were handwritten, lacked heart, and gave the allusion that someone is pious.

The disciples were searching for a deeper prayer life based on what they observed about Jesus' earthly ministry. He demonstrated a repeat pattern of retreating to private prayer before going forth in public ministry. They watched him work miracles, heal the sick of all kinds of diseases, restore sight to the blind, cause the lame to walk, open up deaf ears, cast out demons, and many more unrecorded phenomenal happenings. They were convinced that such great signs and wonders were a result of a dedicated and disciplined life of prayer. It is for these reasons the disciples sincerely asked Jesus, "Teach us to pray."

Jesus would provide an outline that would become one of the most famous scriptures in the Bible, known as "The Lord's Prayer." (Matt. 6:9-13) Jesus demonstrated the necessity for personal and private prayer for effective public ministry. While most of us have memorized the Lord's Prayer since our youth, life has taught us prayer must go beyond what we learned in our youth. The Apostle James exhorted, "The earnest prayer of a righteous person has great power and produces wonderful results." (James 5:16 NLT) This is what the disciples witnessed. Jesus prayers were different—they yielded results. This is what we as believers must emulate. Much prayer equals much power all to the glory of God.



As a believer, we too should always have an open teachable heart to learn how to grow and go deeper in prayer. The first ministry for every believer begins in prayer for out of prayer is ministry birthed. If we are going to ever see a great move in our lives and the world, it will be because of the righteous prayers of the saints. Prayer is never a wasted effort. Wasted effort is the failure to pray. I heard a Pastor state that, "When prayer becomes your habit, victory becomes your lifestyle." My heart's desire is to see the awakening of the intercessor in the life of every believer and it begins on your knees. Stay determined to stay faithful to pray and never give up.






# Celebrates Afrcan-American Music Appreciation Month!

Music can change the world because music can change People! This impressive truth has been echoed by many great philosophers, theorists and all who simply recognize its power. And I don't know another group of people that has literally created life changing music and the genres that would establish each than African-Americans. Our musical traditions miraculously survived the violent and restricted diaspora experience and in mid-1800 became widespread through spirituals, minstrel shows and slave songs. Since then, music composed and performed by African Americans has affected, infused, enthused, inspired and motivated people all over the world. So it was a fairly easy proposal to grant, when iconic songwriter Kenny Gamble approached President Jimmy Carter in 1979 to establish June as Black Music Month in America. The actual legislation to proclaim it wasn't secured until 2000 by Dyana Williams. Finally, in just 2009, President Barack Obama proclaimed June as he also renamed the legislation officially as AFRICAN-AMERICAN APPRECIATION MONTH in the United States.

It has been argued that music from Black artists has undergirded or been the impetus for nearly every type of music in this country. Some say it has given America its "swag" and brought people together at many significant times. Most Baby Boomers can almost recite the movements we were experiencing based on songs. "We Shall Overcome", "I Shall Not Be Moved", "Oh Freedom", "Lift Every Voice" and many church hymns were the standards during Civil Rights meetings, marches and protests. "What's Going On", "People Get Ready" and "Say It Loud" were the sounds during the 70's race riots and civil unrest in America. From Rap to Hip-Hop, we certainly could hear the brazenly insulted and impatient position from artists who were determined to tell their stories in 'keeping it real' ways. Their music revealed the cruelty of racism, oppression and strategic domination in more contemporary



# Do You Have a Seat at the Table? 2 Samuel 9:1-11

### I. INTRODUCTION

It has been stated that a father's place is one of leadership and authority in the home. As we embark upon Father's Day, we must consider the awesome responsibility of fathers. Yes, mothers have been an intricate fabric of society but fathers have important duties to fulfill. As men of God, we must set the tone for the home. When children see their fathers as the priest, provider, and protectors, they will feel secure in the home. It is wonderful when mothers can step up to the plate, yet fathers are important in the development of their children.

It is the relentless obligation of both fathers and mothers to see their children have a proper place in society. Our forefathers and foremothers fought against inequalities in society to aid their children in having a seat at the table. When businessmen and businesswomen are seated at the table of opportunity, it is our job to ensure that our black children are properly represented. No one will look out for our children if we fail to fulfill our parental obligations. As fathers, we must check on our children at their respective schools. Yes, fathers must assist in this holy endeavor. In Proverbs 22:6, the bible declares that parents should train up a child in the way that he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it. Are you a part of the biblical training process? As fathers, we cannot leave the training to the schools and the local churches but we must actively engage in proper discipline and training of our children. We must attend PTA meetings, sporting events, and any extracurricular activities that our children are actively engage in. We cannot depend upon someone else to do our job!

Today, more black men and black women have opportunities to reach the staircase of success in the workplace. Yet, we should not be satisfied. We should endeavor to keep on encouraging our young men and young women to put forth their best efforts. In Jeremiah 29:11, it states that "I know the plans that I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." As we approach the text, we find that our God has a way of taking care of the downtrodden, depressed, and defeated lifestyles of society. Let's see how the Lord worked it out for Mephibosheth.

# II. OPPORTUNITY FOR GOOD WORKS, v.1-5

Out of chaos, our God knows how to bless us in spite of our current conditions. When we read 2 Samuel 4:4, we ascertain the reason for Mephibosheth's lame condition. It was because during the time when Saul and Jonathan were killed in battle, the nurse of Mephibosheth dropped him while fleeing from the battle. Prior to



the battle, Mephibosheth had the capacity to be able to walk but due to this unfortunate circumstance, this child is lame for life. As Christians we have to be careful how we deal with people in our path. It is impossible that we can injure people that may never recover from the fall.

When we read the text, we find that after a period of time, David thought about his friend Jonathan. David wanted to show kindness to the house of Jonathan. Sometimes people do not have an opportunity to help someone else. However, when one has the opportunity, we should make it our business to do good works. In verse 2, the bible declares that there was a servant named Ziba of the house of Saul. David gives instruction to go and bring him unto King David. As providence permitted, Ziba became a connection between David and Mephibosheth. King David asked a question, "Where is Mephibosheth?" The servant Ziba responded that Mephibosheth is in Lodebar. As King David learned of the exact location of Mephibosheth, David sent men to go and bring Mephibosheth to the kingdom. When the Lord God decides to bless us, it does not matter where we are. Our Lord God can get a blessing to us even if we are in Lodebar!

# III. APPRECIATION FOR THE OPPORTUNITY, v.6-8

When the Lord God makes a way for us, we should appreciate the goodness of the Lord God. We should approach the Lord in a humble way. We should not take the blessings of the Lord as the Lord owes us a debt. We owe the Lord everything? Have you ever met a person that acted like you owed them something? Some people in life act as if the world owes them something.

In verse 6, we learn that when Mephibosheth approached King David, he fell on his face to show reverence to him. It is the manner in how we approach the Lord that makes the difference. Mephibosheth was afraid because he did not know what would happen to him. However, King David silences his fears. King David informs Mephibosheth to fear not for he will

surely show kindness to him because of thy father's sake. Aren't you glad that because of Jesus, our Lord God shows kindness to us and brings us closer to Him? After King David calms the fears of Mephibosheth, we see that Mephibosheth's spirit is put at ease. Our God knows how to calm our spirits. Mephibosheth stated in verse 8, "What is thy servant that David should look upon such a dead dog as himself? Do you see the humble spirit that Mephibosheth had before King David? Mephibosheth does not claim to be the grandson of King Saul but rather he claims the servant position.

In verse 7, we hear the comforting words from King David, "thou shall eat at my table continually." It is an awesome position to be invited to the King's table. Mephibosheth will be taken care of for the rest of his life.

# IV. THE RIGHT RESPONSE TO A GOOD OPPORTUNITY, v.9-11

In verse 9, King David called Saul's servant unto him. The words that are spoken in verse 9 are absolute powerful words. King David stated, "I have given unto thy master's son all that pertained to Saul and to his entire house. In verse 10, King David states "thou therefore and thy sons, and thy servants shall till the land for Mephibosheth. Also, thou shall bring in the fruits that thy master's son may have food to eat."

In verse 11 we hear the response of Ziba, "according to all that King David has commanded his servant, so shall the servant do." As for Mephibosheth, said King David, he shall eat at my table, as one of the king's sons. Ziba responded as one that would make the most of a good opportunity. When we are presented with good opportunities in life, do we make the most of a good opportunity? Do we maintain a spirit of humility when the Lord God is blessing up 2

Our Lord has made a way for us through the plan of salvation. If we accept Jesus as our personal Savior, then we will have a seat at the divine table. "Do you have a seat at the table?"
