# "The LEADER'S EDGE" by drmichaelbell

Have you ever stopped to consider the consequences of the choices that you make? I hope the answer is yes because choices have consequences. You and I make many choices throughout every day. Some choices we are aware of and others are so innate that they've become habits. Each choice does, of course, have consequences, with both pluses and minuses.

Again, choices and consequences are inextricably bound. This is one of the most important lessons for leaders. We can't expect to get the consequences we want if we make unwise choices.. And every choice is important. There are no inconsequential choices.

Church leaders are required to make decisions every day and churches are like many other entities in that people have opinions and can have strong feelings about how things are done. Churches make countless decisions about things like how to relate to members and how members relate to each other, strategic planning, budgeting, ministry programs, who does what and when, internal operations, and so much more.

There are typically three groups of people that make church decisions. Each has a different perspective, but all feel like they have the best interest of the church at heart.

- Members. Utilizing the skills and knowledge base of members is a great way to enhance church operations and validate membership involvement. I, personally, encourage every supportive member to use their voice.
- Pastor. A pastor feels called of God, and his or her focus is to implement the vision that God has given him or her for the church. Most churches in the Black idiom are not multi-staffed. In some instances, small-church pastors are part-time secretary, part-time business administrator, part-time custodian and part-time sound system operator/videographer. The pastor's role in decision-making is contingent on the way the church is orga-



nized. Let me add this footnote: No matter how much leverage a pastor might have in the local church setting, he or she would be wise to regularly consult the church's lay leadership.

• Board and Councils. Some churches are led by a Deacon Board and/or a Trustee Board. The responsibilities of the boards and councils and how they relate to the pastor need to be well defined if the church is to fulfill God's purposes.

A healthy church does a good job of balancing all of these different perspectives. Church leaders in a healthy church make decisions together. Decisions are team efforts. They involve different people with different priorities trying to reach agreement on a shared problem which, admittedly, isn't an easy thing to do.

There is one more footnote I need to share with you. Within the realm of Christian leadership, decision making should be undergirded by Biblical foundations. The Word of God is the bedrock upon which all good decision-making is built. God's Word guides our decision-making. From simple, everyday choices to the big things us in our lives. It is the only trustworthy basis for the beginning of thoughts, ideas, actions and practices. James 1:5 provides us with excellent counsel: "If you do not have wisdom, ask God for it. He is always ready to give it to you and will never say you are wrong for asking."

# **National Juneteenth Museum launches in Fort Worth**

The National Juneteenth Museum will be built in Fort Worth as part of a mixed-use development that will help revitalize the city's Historic Southside neighborhood.

Declared a federal holiday on June 17, 2021, when President Joe Biden signed the law with Opal Lee by his side, Juneteenth has sparked celebrations worldwide. Juneteenth commemorates freedom for the enslaved via the abolition of slavery in the United States.

Lee is affectionately known as the Grandmother of Juneteenth and has been leading the charge to see the National Juneteenth Museum become a reality.

"To have lived long enough to see my walking and talking make an impact is one thing, but to know that a state-of-the-art museum that will house the actual pen that President Biden used to sign the bill, and many other exhibits, is coming to pass as well -- I could do my holy dance again," Lee said.

The National Juneteenth Museum will be erected on land that currently houses Lee's Fort Worth Juneteenth Museum that has served the community for nearly two decades and was a production location in the feature film Miss Juneteenth.

As the epicenter for the preservation of Juneteenth history



and a center for discussions about freedom, the new museum will host events and exhibits that foster continued conversation on the global significance of freedom and the celebration of Juneteenth worldwide. The museum will also host seminars and lectures by renowned authorities on historical perspectives of freedom.

The museum will be led by a collaboration of activists, researchers, historians and everyday people who understand the influence of history on the trajectory of the human experience. It will educate guests on the legacy and experiences of the enslaved and provide factual narratives about people who overcame the trials and hardships of oppression.

Fort Worth Mayor Mattie Parker said she is excited to add this concept to an already renowned collection of world-class museums in the city. "For decades, Juneteenth has been part of the fabric of our city, and this museum is a welcome addition to its incredible legacy."

### "A Life of Gratitude"

And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God. (Luke 17:15)

Ten men comprised of Jews and Samaritans, which in and of itself is an uncommon mix, all shared a common denominator—they all bore a disease known as leprosy. Oxford Dictionary defines leprosy as a "contagious bacterial disease that affects the skin, mucous membranes, and nerves, causing discoloration and lumps on the skin and, in severe cases, disfigurement and deformities." In Biblical times if you had leprosy you were labeled as an outcast, quarantined from the general public, and considered unclean because of the severity of the disease.

These "outcasts" obviously spent a lot of time with each other and may have very well tried to think of a way they could be healed of their misery. That day came when they heard about a man named Jesus who was healing the sick and making His way through their town. These men formed a chorus and sang a song entitled, "Have mercy on us." Their song obviously got the attention of Jesus for the Bible says that Jesus "saw" them. He responded not only to their song but to their faith with a single command to present themselves before the priest for examination. Although healing had not yet manifested, their song of faith turned into a walk of faith, which led to their

healing. Nine joyfully continued on their journey to see the priest as Jesus had instructed except one. Was he disobedient to the Master's instructions? On the contrary, this nameless outcast recognized that the miraculous healing that manifested in his life and that of his nine cohorts was worthy of personal thanksgiving and gratitude. So, rather than continue with his buddies, he broke ranks, and returned back to the One who took the time to acknowledge his faith and transform his life.

What can we learn from this les-

son? Faith gets the attention of the Master, not pity or despair although He is not deaf to the cries of His hurting child. Never take for granted the goodness of the Lord, the kindness of the Lord, the grace of the Lord nor the favor of the Lord. It was not that the one leper was disobedient to Jesus' instruction. It was that he recognized that he owed Jesus an in-person thank you. Greetings cards, delivered flowers, and text messages are all wonderful expressions of gratitude but there is nothing more personable than an in-person contact of gratitude. There is no injury to breaking away from the crowd to get away to worship. Because this one man turned back to express his appreciation, he received something even greater for his gratitude—the saving of his soul.

Jesus did not single out any of the ten lepers. They were all touched by His love, grace, and mercy. The least likely one is the one who was most appreciative of them all and



demonstrated it when he went back to where his new began. This year has had many ups and downs. However, I encourage you to take a moment to forget not those graceful moments in your life where you experienced the Father's salvation, healing, deliverance, and protection, not once in your life but time and time again. (See Psalm 103)

We are also reminded to have a heart of gratitude and not take for granted those who have shown kindness to us. We can all get so busy caught up in our everyday lives and forget about those who have helped us along the way. It doesn't cost much to express gratitude and to say, thank you." Just as you are thankful for the gift, forget not the giver. As you are quick to pray, be quick to praise.

So dear hearts, be determined to forget not all that the Father and others have done by extending kindness in your life. In everything be thankful for this is the will of God concerning you in Christ Jesus



# ARLINGTON-Aug. 30, 1956, is a little-known anniversary in the Metroplex education system.



On that day, Pastor Floyd S. Moody and two other students attempted to integrate public schools in Mansfield, Texas. This was in Tarrant County two years after Brown v. Board of Education and a year before the Little Rock Nine attempted the same in Arkansas.

The Mansfield Three, as they became known, were unsuccessful. After being denied enrollment by members of the white community in Mansfield and Tarrant County, who formed mobs and barricades to stop the students from entering, Texas Gov. Allan Shivers would ultimately side with the community, sending Texas Rangers -- the law enforcement, not the baseball team -- to uphold segregation.

The school district was integrated the following year.

Now, the baseball Texas Rangers are working to raise awareness for the history of the little-known event and to celebrate Pastor Moody and the Black community in Tarrant County.

The club is partnering with the Black on Base Negro Leagues for Project the Positivity Night as the club takes on the Colorado Rockies on the 65th anniversary of the fight to integrate Mansfield High School.

A number of pregame ceremonies were planned to commemorate the event. Pastor Moody, the lone surviving member of the Mansfield Three, threw out the first pitch. His daughter, Beverly Lightfoot sang the national anthem alongside the Ministers Justice Coalition of Texas choir. Donations from the game and the pregame ceremonies will be donated to the Black on Base nonprofit organization.

"[The Rangers] were kind of touched by my story, and they wanted to do something for the neighborhood and for the Black community," Pastor Moody said. "I'm pleased and thankful for the Rangers and what they have done and what they will do. It's a situation where everybody will be blessed."

The Rangers became aware of Pastor Moody and the Mansfield Three story when the Ministers Justice Coalition and Black on Base met with the front office earlier this year. Pastor KP Tatum, who is now the reverend at Moody's New Mount Rose Missionary Baptist Church in Fort Worth, worked with the Rangers to coordinate the event.

The biggest theme of the day comes from Pastor Moody himself: "Get Better, Not Bitter" -- which is a call for unity, even through tough and negative events like what he went through with the attempt to integrate Mansfield.

"When we had the opportunity to meet with Pastor Moody and

Pastor Tatum, it was one of those things where we knew we needed to listen." said Rangers director of community impact Ray Casas. "And I think listening is incredibly important. That's the only way we're going to get better as a commu-

"When we heard the story, we just tried to figure out how we could honor Pastor

Moody and his work. A lot of people would have just been angry, but the way that Pastor Moody has lived his life, and how he taught people to live with courage and conviction, I mean, allowing him to throw out the first pitch was the least we could

In his retirement at 82 years old, Pastor Moody has been focused on building a better community for Black kids in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. Part of that has always been through

Pastor Moody admits that he was never very good at baseball, but he played and coached in Tarrant County. Whether he's good or bad at the sport itself, his main focus is helping young Black men in the community.

One of the most prideful things of Pastor Moody's life was watching boys he coached grow up to be doctors and lawyers and any number of other professions.

So it means that much more to Pastor Moody that the Rangers are stepping forward to help the Black community in recent years. Starting with the Texas Rangers MLB Youth Academy, the organization has consistently worked to share the sport of baseball with the community and grow together.

"With the Rangers on our side, I feel like we can't lose," Moody said. "We're going forward with the Rangers and I thank God for the Rangers, what they are doing and what they might do in the future. I'm optimistic about it. I believe that good things will come from what we're doing now."

Could be you're suffering the ills of a bad decision or a rebellious act but know this... your Lord will never leave you or forsake you. Even within your dilemma, he is reminding you that every good gift and every perfect gift comes down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. So, don't despair. Like the people of God in Babylonian exile, turn your eyes back to Jesus and make the most of your situation. He is still with you.






