

"The LEADER'S EDGE" by drmichaelbell

How is your Congregation faring in the midst of the ongoing global health pandemic we know as SARS-CoV-2 or COVID-19? Churches across the country were forced to close their doors and congregants spent weeks and even months apart. Studies have shown that, on the average, it can take 66 days for a new behavior to become automatic. If your Church had to shutter its doors for almost four months, right at 112 days, then your Pastor and leaders have had to address how to keep the membership connected. And, the question your Church has had to address is how to build community and keep connected while people are social distancing and sheltering in place? How do you provide encouragement and connection for your congregation while reaching out to a new and broader digital audience?

As Churches reopen, congregational leaders are going to have to face the fact that at least a few former worshippers, who weren't heavily engaged in the life of the Church in the first place, may choose to permanently disengage. Like Elvis, they've left the building and might not return...

According to the 2018-2019 National Congregations Study, nearly a third of all congregations have no savings; approximately 20 percent streamed their services and 48 percent were able to accept donations electronically pre-COVID, making it more challenging for most churches to serve the faithful and gather their donations during the virus shutdown. The short of it is that some Churches will not survive the pan-

Hopefully, your Church Pastor and leadership immediately went into "Thrive mode" rather than "Survive mode" at the first hint that Church closures were on the horizon. If a Congregation didn't already have emergency policies and procedures in place - and most Congregations didn't - within the first week of the lockdown, plans and strategies should have been put together on how to keep congregants in the loop during the shelter-in-place restrictions.

While your Church may not be able to meet in-person, this is not the time to take a break! If your Church hasn't started in-person worship yet, hopefully, it has a digital/online presence, whether ble study. Just to get your creative country.



juices flowing here are a few innovative ideas that work and will help keep your Congregation con-

- Offer Online Bible Studies and Small Groups. Virtual small groups can give new participants the opportunity to lead discussions and use provided chat rooms to facilitate the interaction. During this difficult time, when people feel isolated and afraid, it is more important than ever to provide positive, encouraging Christ-centered study content. Utilize an online meeting service like Zoom or Whereby to get "face to face" and talk with one another using computer cam-
- Schedule virtual Worship Service(s). No more 2-hour worship services! A Call Sheet will help you keep your worship service to 60 minutes. I wouldn't recommend that a service last longer than 75 minutes tops. There is no one-size-fits-all when it comes to the tone of your worship. However, a full choir is not a good idea. Having a psalmist or soloist accompanied by your Music Team is more suitable during this season of challenge.
- Keep your Congregation Praying. More than anything, people need to come together in prayer. Calendar at least one Corporate Prayer opportunity each week using one or more of the online platforms. You can ask people to post or email their prayer requests and then spend a few minutes praying for needs in families, your community, city, state, country and the world.

A Life of Trust

Trust in the LORD with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take." (Prov. 3:5-6 NLT)

As a little girl, I was taught that trust is not given; it is earned. Trust means a firm belief in someone or something. It is accepting the truth of a statement without evidence or investigation. As a child, my mother selflessly made sure I was cared for and had what I needed. She proved by her love I could trust her. For over 35 years, Bishop and I have proven by our love and faithfulness that we can trust each other. My life and witness as a mentor and spiritual leader have fostered relationships of trust with those whom I counsel that I am one who can be trusted especially with delicate and confidential matters.

As we are in the midst of a worldwide pandemic, trust is being challenged as to who and what to believe. There exists a rise in information and misinformation. It all boils down to just who do you trust. Whose reputation speaks for itself. Whose word has been consistently honest? Who genuinely cares for the welfare and wellbeing of the people without ulterior motives? Solomon gives the answer in verse one when he said, "never forget the words I have taught you. Follow closely every truth that I've given you." In other words, trust the Father and His Word. The word "trust" in this context means to be confident, secure, and safe. Solomon teaches that we as believers can be confident that our security and safety rests in the care of a Loving Father. His very nature speaks for itself that He is a God that can be trusted.

As you store the Father's Word securely in your heart you build a treasure chest of trust towards Him. This is why private study is so important. It is also vital to be connected with leadership, God's spiritual authority, who can teach and develop you in the Word and guide you into a path of righteous and moral living.

Solomon admonishes us to be loyal to God's Word, making it such an integral part of our daily lives like wearing a necklace. Whether through favorable or unfavorable times, God's Word has a way of springing up within you to give you life. Understanding and adhering to the Holy Word builds faith in God, promotes character living, and fosters healthy relationships. We all have been prey to trust being broken in one way or another,



which is why the act of trusting can be so challenging. Solomon warns us to not trust in our opinion, our emotions, our roller coaster thinking, or logical concepts, but trust in the Father to help mend broken trust. He even knows how to reveal to you who and what to trust. Jesus told us that Holy Spirit will guide us into truth. (John 16:13)

Having trust in God and faith in His Word will motivate you to do that which pleases Him and yield forth favor on your behalf. Therefore, dear hearts be determined to trust in the Lord at all times to give you sound counsel and always steer you in the right direction.

VIRTUAL VICTORIES

Well it has been 6 months since our world turned upside down with COVID-19 and all of its associated traumas. The immediate directive to 'shelter in' was not completely understood, initially. Who knew that no school or work would turn into home schooling and remote work assignments? Of course, after in-dining restaurants, movie theatres, amusement parks, conventions and concerts were all canceled, it got real. Restricted pampering of hair, nails and faces was seen as excessive and punitive, if some were to explain it. But for we who attended the Lord's House a minimum of 1-3 times per week, we knew things were really about to change. Or were they?

For some, streaming services, online giving and recorded sermons were not new. Just ask the 20-somethings. But, the technology regime has always been the leveling tool between mega-churches and small ministries. Websites and social media platforms have, for years now, been the most productive and progressive way to be seen worldwide and 24/7. However in mid-March 2020, telecommunications became


"the" way to worship together and stay connected to the Pastor from whom the Lord had directed you to hear His Holy Word on the regular. Slowly and effectively, we saw Pastoral teams, Worship leaders, singers. Music Directors with bands and the most important Media Staff become 'Essential Workers' to the body of Christ and the lost who were seeking Him. And wow have we been blessed and impressed while remaining unstressed and undressed!! Er-ruh-uh, not dressed UP, I meant. Yaasss, if you have not been assigned on certain weeks for any of the worship recordings or presentations, you have literally been able to lift up holy hands with breakfast and be on time to every service by an alarm clock set 10 minute before service starts.

Gospel music and its creatives have not missed a beat; not virtually that is. We have been able to watch full gospel concerts, artist interviews, industry panelists pontificating, cooking shows, daily prayer sessions, workout videos, vocal lessons, real-time studio sessions, social commentary musings and fully anointed worship services. REDEMPTION BOWL FOOD DAY GIVEAWAY SERVES 20,000 IMPACTED BY PANDEMIC

Multiple Fort Worth churches and community organizations teamed up for the 12th Redemption Bowl Food Day Giveaway on July 11, 2020, in Fort Worth, Texas.



With the COVID-19 Pandemic as its impetus, the Redemption Bowl has nity just as Jesus Christ did when he fed 20,000 of Fort Worth's hungry, mainly in the inner city, since its inception in March.

"It is the needy helping the needy," said K.P. Tatum, pastor of New Mount Rose Missionary Baptist Church and coordinator for the food distribution events. "This event is - a 120-day unbelievable ride with no budget, all volunteers, and all the food donated. Let me tell vou: we were running on empty at the end."

Pastor Tatum credits the Lord and the volunteers effort for much of the success of this event.

"With 25 to 250 volunteers at a time, we sometimes had more volunteers than we had food," said Tatum. "But, you know, we called it the Redemption Bowl because everybody needs a little redemption; we all do. So I say, serve from the heart, your whole heart. I don't call it hard work; I call it 'Heart Work'".

Among the many volunteers at this final event were a team of 18 missionaries from The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

"Service brings me joy," said Sister Bristol, a young missionary of The Church of Jesus Christ. "According to leading researchers, Fort Worth 76104 has the lowest life expectancy in the entire State of Texas," said Pastor Tatum. "The mission of the You Better Mask Somebody Project is to help stop the spread of COVID-19. With mandates across the state and country to wear masks in public, providing free masks and other resources to our most isolated communities and vulnerable populations has become the mission of The New Mount Rose Missionary Baptist Church of Fort Worth, Texas."

With the aid of the Buddhist Huong Dao Temple of Fort Worth, which donated 7,000 masks, and the Department of Health and Human Services, 50,000 face masks have been distributed.

In the spirit of thanksgiving memhers of The New Mount Rose Mischurches, and community organizers are set to travel on July 23, 2020. to the Texas State Capitol to donate over 12,000 cloth masks to be distributed by Ms. Anna C. Blake, Director of Faith-Based and Community Engagement for the Texas Department of Family in Austin, Texas. This event will take place at 3 pm in front of the Capitol.


